COVID Protocol for Volunteers—Board Revised 08/25/21

Senior Gleaners STRONGLY ENCOURAGES all volunteers and guest volunteers to be fully vaccinated at the level recommended by local and national health agencies. SG expects all volunteers to manage their activity based on individual risk factors and comfort levels.

Volunteers not vaccinated are required to wear a mask at all times and to notify their crew leader/grocery van driver and crew members/van occupants that they are not vaccinated so that others may take any precautions deemed necessary.

Drivers of carpools and the SG van may or may not require all occupants to wear a mask. Drivers also set rules for number of passengers, ventilation, etc.

All volunteers will wear masks when interacting with resident donors and with staff at distribution sites and grocery pickup sites.

This protocol will remain in effect until:

- a. Local county guidelines require more strict masking/distancing.
- OR**
- b. All governmental jurisdictions drop all mask requirements and recommendations.

Board members will review the current protocol at the next board meeting.

THIS IS WHAT YOUR GRANDMA NEVER TAUGHT YOU

Basic Food Safety Training is the core training module for food servers, handlers and preparers. It teaches key principles to keep food and customers safe. This FDA-compliant course includes information on: Cross Contamination, Temperature Control, Personal Hygiene and dozens of other topics food workers must understand and successfully perform.

Take your food handlers course from any on-line training course specifically for San Diego County (examples: eFoodhandlers, www.premierfoodsafety.com). Pay the \$7.95-9.95 course fee. Pass the exam, then instantly print your certificate or card to give to Trixxie and receive a special Senior Gleaner hat noting you are a Certified Food Handler. Send your receipt to Pradip Mistry (Senior Gleaners Treasurer-Pradip.mistry@att.net) for reimbursement of the course cost. Our goal is to have at least one Certified Food Handler at every pick.

The volunteer appreciation picnic was held at Mission Bay park on April 20, 2022. There was plenty of wonderful food that was shared. The day was fabulous. A special THANK YOU to our speakers.

1. **Jimbo's** Marketing Director Kelly Hartford and Stephanie Morris, their Sustainability Coordinator, told us a little bit about the Wooden Nickel program and other philanthropic endeavors Jimbo's does for the community. They also provided 4 twenty dollar coupons that were raffled off during the picnic. **Shop at Jimbo's this quarter. Get a wooden nickel for each grocery bag you bring to the store and donate your wooden nickel to SG. In a prior campaign, SG received nearly \$400!**
2. Hayley Bratt from **PATH** (People Assisting the Homeless) told us a bit about PATH in San Diego. They maintain 5 different housing facilities for San Diego as well as serving three meals a day to the unhoused at the 6th street location. Senior Gleaners have delivered 2,700 pounds of fruit to PATH in 2021 and 2022 and Margaret and Daryush pick up and deliver groceries to PATH twice a week.
3. **Ann Gero-Stillwell**, a gleaner from the Clairemont group said a few words about what gleaning means to her.
 - a. It ticks all my boxes; it's useful, fun, outdoors, reduces waste, feeds people who need food...
 - b. I feel enmeshed in layers of generosity: the donors who work to grow food and offer it; the pickers who give time, work, gas...;the distributors who organize and offer. And on the receiving end, people who share what they pick up, or go for neighbors, etc.
 - c. It's my image of Eden, you stretch out your hand and perfect fruit falls into it.
4. **Vicky Roberts** shared her knowledge about companion planting. We will follow up with a whole article on this information in our next newsletter.
5. **Margaret Burton** thanked all those for attending and offered a dollar for dollar match for any donations to Senior Gleaners made until June 19 (her birthday) up to a total of \$10,000. Give generously! Max out her donation!
