The Asian citrus psyllid is a pest that acts as a carrier or vector spreading huanglongbing (HLB), a devastating disease of citrus trees. This bacterial disease is transmitted to healthy trees by the psyllid after it feeds on infected plant tissue. We now have two quarantine areas in North County. The map shows the quarantine areas in blue. No fruit is allowed to leave the property in the quarantine area which means Gleaners cannot pick fruit in these areas. Management is monitoring pick requests in this area and informing the donors that we will not be able to pick their trees. The psyllid looks like a grain of brown rice and produces a white, waxy liquid in the nymph stage. The bugs feed on leaves with their bodies at a 45-degree angle. What you need to do to limit the spread:

- 1. Make sure no stems or leaves are included in the fruit we pick.
- Know what the symptoms of ACP look like and report it to your team leader should you suspect a tree you are picking has the disease.
- 3. Cover all loads being transported.
- 4. Wash your poles, buckets and tools between picks.
- 5. Bag leaves, stems and fruit and dispose of it as trash on the property.
- 6. Educate yourself on the ACP and be aware when picking.
